Programme

Details

Monday 26 August

Participants will arrive gradually in the afternoon.

The official welcome will take place at 17:00. The program, training objectives and methodologies will be presented. A short tour of the site will be proposed.

Tuesday 27 August

In the morning, an introductory lecture and case studies will allow participants to learn about the history and major challenges of cooperation between cities and regions in Europe.

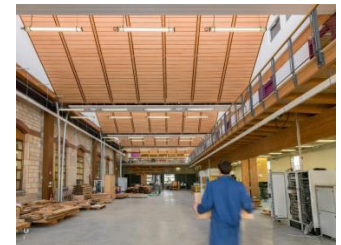
In the afternoon, a visit to the Cité-Abbaye will help to understand the relationships and interactions between the territory and its network. Participants will identify the elements on which a territorial outreach strategy can be based and will identify networking and network development strategies

A round table will then be organised around the theme of multi-stakeholder cooperation in Europe, with a focus on local and regional examples. This round table will take place in the Halle Bois of the Ecole des Arts et Métiers, where researchers, locally elected officials and economic actors cooperate to promote innovation, use forest resources in short circuits and develop the territory's assets.

Wednesday 28 August

In the morning, an overview of European tools and mechanisms facilitating cooperation between cities and regions will be presented (European Union projects and programmes, cross-border, multilateral and institutional cooperation, etc.).

In the afternoon, exchanges will be organized with professionals of cooperation.



Thursday 29 August

In the morning, the meeting with professionals of cooperation will continue in a workshop format, where everyone will have the opportunity to explore new approaches:

- 1/ to engage regional and local actors for international cooperation
- 2/ to develop international cooperation and exchanges to increase the resilience and potential for innovation of territories

In the afternoon, a collaborative workshop will be held to strengthen the knowledge acquired define regional outreach strategies based on practical cases from different territories.

Friday 30 August

The last morning of the seminar will be focused on the assessment of the training and its evaluation by the participants.

A forward-looking conference on "Networks, innovation and territories" will show how cooperation increases the innovation potential and resilience of territories.

Examples

Participants will have the opportunity to visit a location involved in local and regional projects.

A meal at the “Au pain sur la table” will be offered to the participants, in order to present one of the main Cooperative Societies of Collective Interest of the Burgundy-Franche-Comté region. It was born from the cooperation between different actors within the framework of the European programme called EQUAL and financed by the European Social Fund (ESF).
